The LIFE Programme is the EU's main funding instrument for environment and climate action and a **key driver of the European Green Deal, with €601.5 million available for 2026.**

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# Why LIFE matters

## Areas of intervention of the EU's dedicated funding instrument for environment and climate action

The LIFE Programme is structured into four sub-programmes that represent the key areas of intervention, out of which TWO sub-programmes are related to Environment:

- Sub-programme «**Nature and Biodiversity**»: reinforcing and mainstreaming the implementation of EU policies for safeguarding and reviving wildlife habitats and species across sectors, in line with the Biodiversity Strategy objectives for 2030;
- Sub-programme «**Circular Economy and Quality of Life**»: facilitating the transition to a circular economy while enhancing the quality of natural resources such as air, soil, and water within the EU.
- Sub-programme «**Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation**»: Supports the transition to a climate-neutral and resilient economy by funding projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and foster adaptation to climate impacts.
- Sub-programme «**Clean Energy Transition**»: Builds on previous EU energy programmes to drive the shift toward a renewable, energy-efficient and climate-neutral economy. Key areas include policy support, technology deployment, financing, local investment, and citizen participation. The Clean Energy Transition sub-programme includes 13 specific topics.



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# Funding instruments

The LIFE Programme includes Action grants and Operating grants (grants represent at least 85% of the budget) and different types of grants respond to specific actions:

- ✓ Standard action projects (SAP)
- ✓ Strategic nature projects (SNAP) for Nature & Biodiversity and Strategic integrated projects (SIP)
- ✓ Technical assistance projects
- ✓ Coordination and support actions (CSA)
- ✓ Projects addressing ad hoc Legislative and Policy Priorities (PLP)
- ✓ Operating Grants



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# Funding instruments

## 1- Standard Action Projects:

Aim to **develop, demonstrate and promote innovative techniques, methods and approaches** and catalyse the large-scale deployment of successful technical and policy-related solutions for implementing EU legislation and policy.

- Circular economy and Zero Pollution – Environment : €79 M
- Nature and Biodiversity : €166 M
- Nature Governance: €7.5 M
- Environmental Governance: €6.5 M
- Climate change adaptation: €28 M
- Climate change mitigation: €28 M
- Climate governance: €4 M



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# Funding instruments

## 2- Strategic Nature Projects:

Aim to **support the full implementation of prioritised action frameworks** for Natura 2000 and other plans/strategies to implement European nature and biodiversity policies with measurable actions and clear timeline and budget. Total budget: €75 M

## 3- Strategic Integrated Projects:

Aim to implement – from a regional to a transnational scale – **environmental or climate strategies** or action plans developed by Member States' authorities.

Strategic Integrated Climate Projects: €30 M

Strategic Integrated Environment Projects: €58 M



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# Funding instruments

## 4- Technical assistance

For preparing SIPs and SNaPs: €1 M

## 5- Coordination and support action grants

For the clean energy transition sub-programme: aims to support projects focused on **capacity building, information sharing and raising awareness** of renewable energy and energy efficiency.

Total budget: €85.5 M

## 6- Specific Operating Grant Agreements. (SGA OGs) for NGOs: €15 M

In general: **Eligible costs include: personnel, subcontracting, equipment and other direct costs. LIFE can cover 60–70 % of eligible costs, up to 95 % for certain actions and depending on the type of company.**



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# Distribution of the LIFE budget

The LIFE programme's total budget for 2021–2027 is commonly cited as about €5.45 billion in external programme material, with around €2.15 billion for Nature and Biodiversity, €1.35 billion for Circular Economy and Quality of Life, €0.95 billion for Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation, and €1 billion for Clean Energy Transition.

- An entity from a third country associated to the LIFE programme;
- A legal entity created under Union law or any international organisation.



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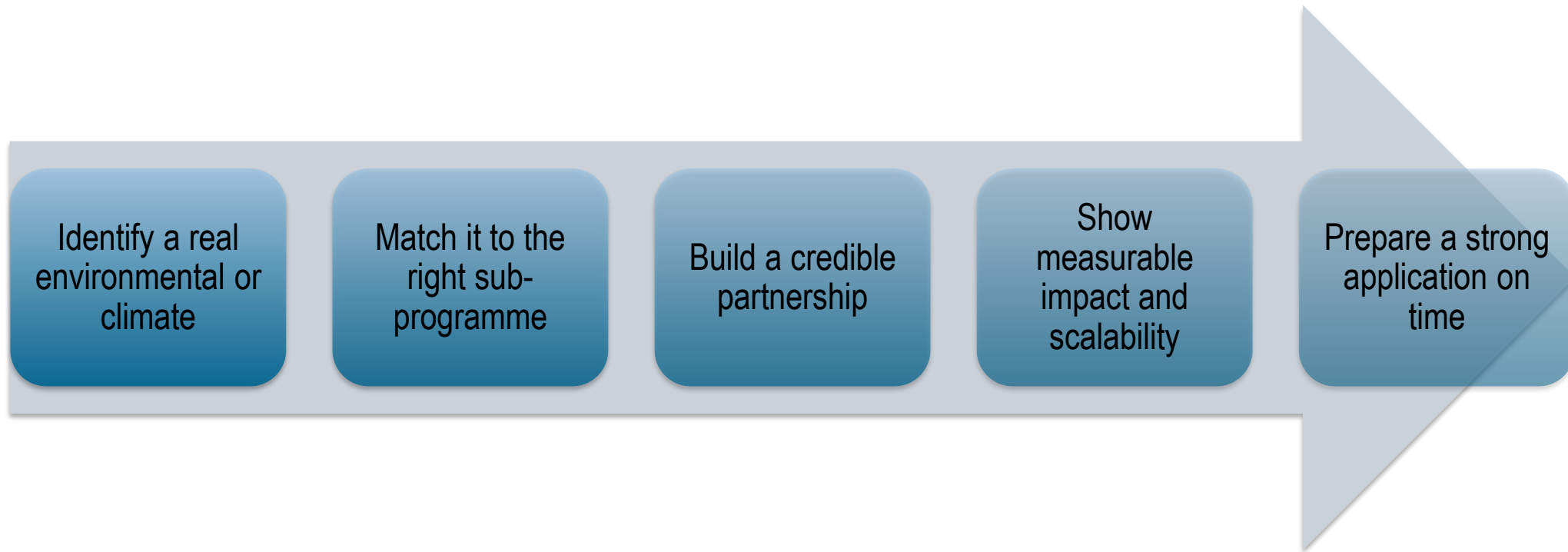

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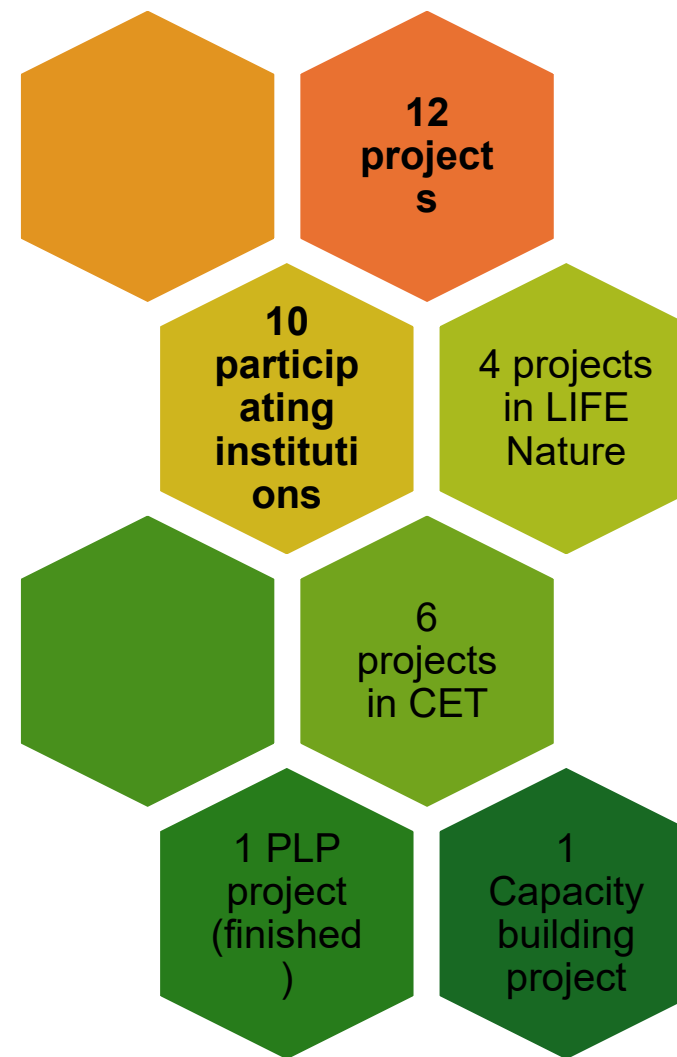


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# Leveraging LIFE Funding in North Macedonia

North Macedonia formally associated with the EU's LIFE Programme on July 3, 2023, opening access to funding for environment, climate action, and clean energy transition projects.

As a newly associated country, North Macedonia is currently building institutional capacity to leverage these funds, particularly through initiatives like the eHUB4LIFE project.



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# Leveraging LIFE Funding in North Macedonia

## 1. North Macedonia's participation in LIFE

North Macedonia became an **associated country to LIFE in 2023**. It is the **only Western Balkan country so far** to be associated with LIFE (joined before Montenegro in 2025), which positions it as a “pioneer” in the region for accessing EU-level environmental and climate co-funding.

Compared to large EU member states, North Macedonia's **absolute participation (number of projects and total budget share)** is still low.

2. By mid-2026, **only a small number of LIFE projects** involving North Macedonian partners have been launched, but they are strategically clustered in:

- Climate Action – Clean Energy Transition (CET):  
e.g., LIFE23-CET-OSS-HABITAT, LIFE24-CET-BUSUnited
- Environment – Circular Economy and Quality of Life:

Most of the projects are in the LIFE Nature, **often in partnership with Western EU partners**.

## 3. Success patterns and success rate

Publicly available LIFE statistics do not yet break out a formal “success rate” specifically for North Macedonia. However, evidence points to two trends: High-value, visible projects – North Macedonia has already secured at least one flagship LIFE Climate Action project (LIFE23-CET-OSS-HABITAT), showcasing how a well-designed, nationally owned projects can be competitive even at the early stage.

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# Leveraging LIFE Funding in North Macedonia



## Some observations that could be valuable to know

- **Nature and Biodiversity is dominated by countries with large Natura 2000 networks** and strong biodiversity agencies, such as Italy, Spain, France, Germany, and Poland, which host many flagship LIFE-Nature projects on habitats and species.
- **Circular Economy and Quality of Life sees strong activity also in Belgium, Germany, France, Italy, and the Netherlands**, often linked to urban-scale circular-economy and pollution-reduction projects.
- Across the full LIFE programme the **average success rate is roughly 20–25%**, depending on the sub-programme and call year. For example, for the 2023–2024 calls, success rates were reported around 24% for Climate Action and about 21% for the Circular Economy and Quality of Life.
- In practice, no official “highest-success-rate country” is published, but **Belgium (almost 75%), Spain (50-75%), and France** are often cited as having particularly strong track records and high success in submitting competitive LIFE proposals, especially under **Nature and Biodiversity and Circular Economy**.

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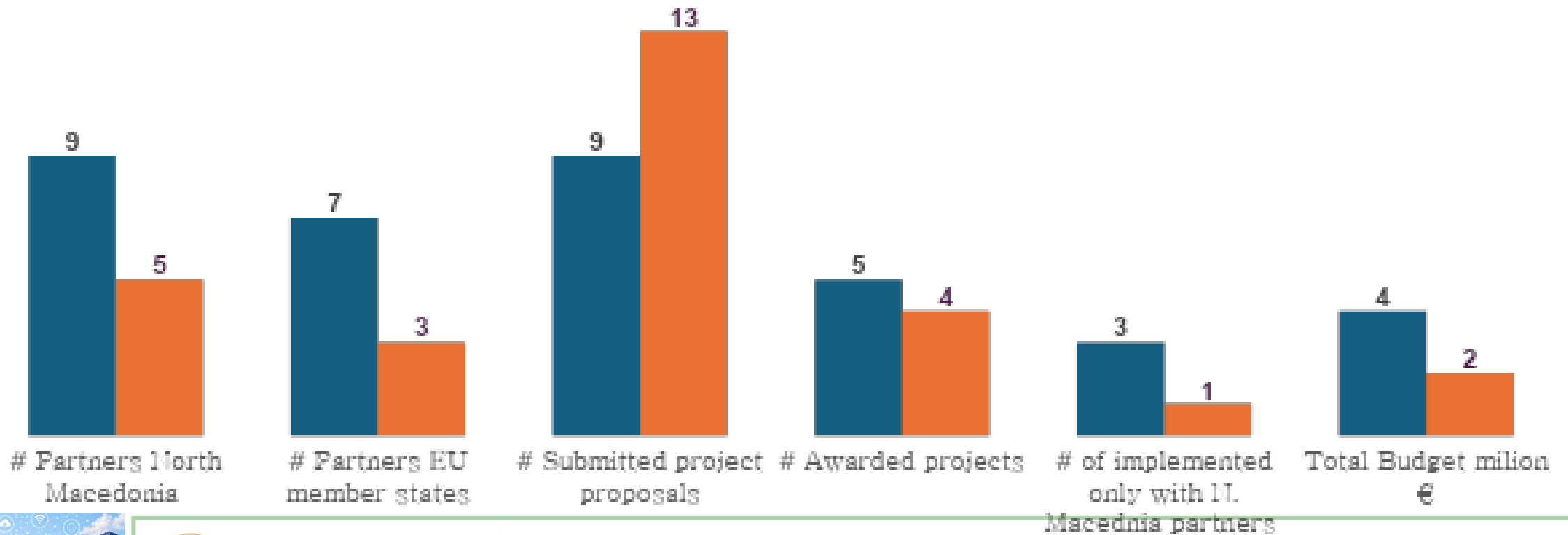

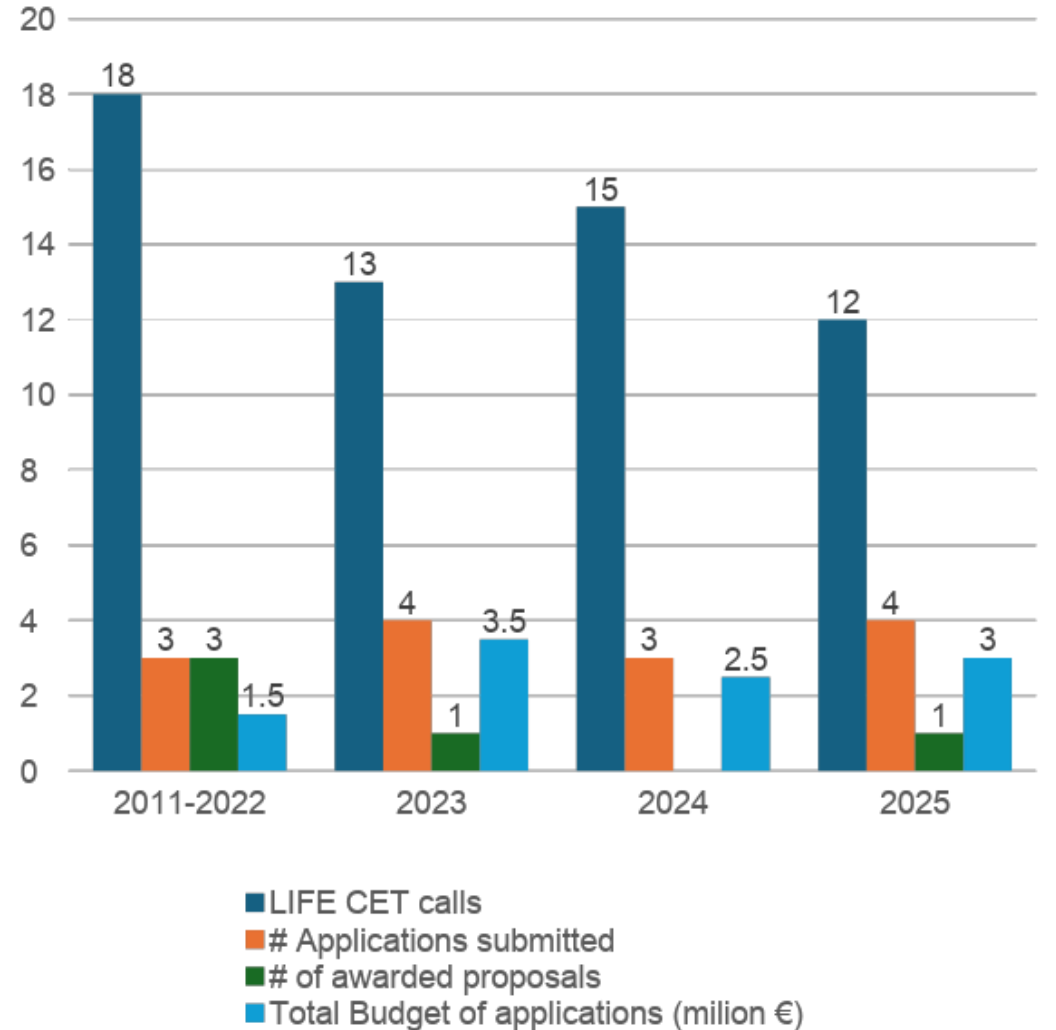

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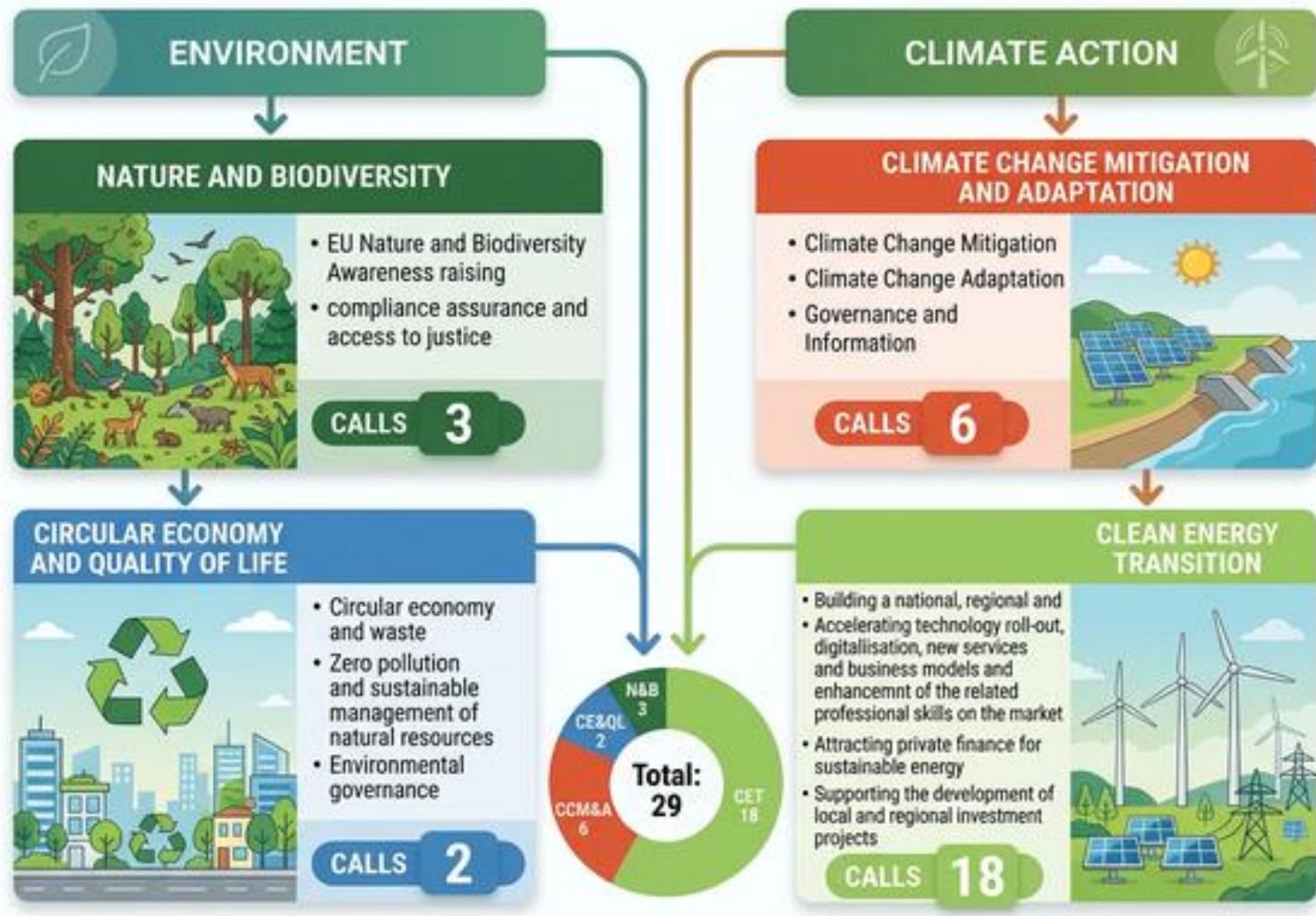

In terms of qualitative impact, proposals under this topic should demonstrate how they will contribute to the following outcomes:

- Increased collaboration between key stakeholders, including public authorities, towards the goal of upskilling professionals in the construction and renovation value chains
- National skills roadmap with detailed measures and action plan addressing the identified skills gaps, endorsed by key stakeholders

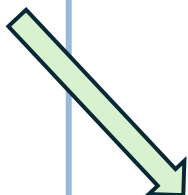

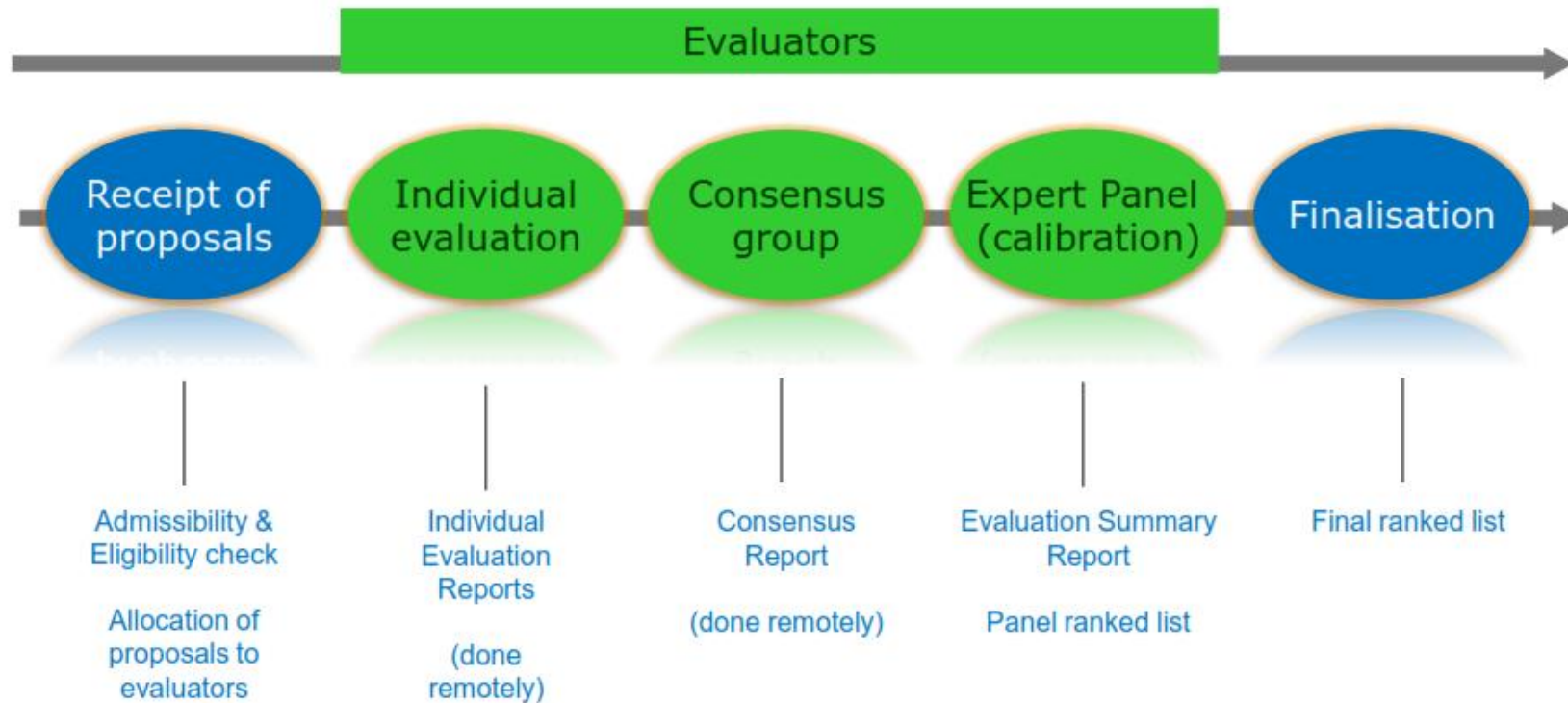

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# Role of independent experts

- No grant negotiation phase!
- The time from submission of a proposal, evaluation and signature of the grant set to a maximum of 9 months
- Evaluate each proposal as submitted, not on its potential if certain changes were to be made
  - If you identify shortcomings (other than minor ones and obvious clerical errors), reflect those in a lower score for the relevant criterion
  - Explain the shortcomings, but do not make recommendations i.e. do not suggest additional partners, additional work packages, resources cut...
  - Proposals with significant weaknesses that prevent the project from achieving its objectives or with resources being seriously over-estimated must not receive above-threshold scores
  - Any proposal with scores above the thresholds and where there is sufficient budget will be selected as submitted
  - Successful applicants are invited to address shortcomings



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# Evaluation overview



## Remote Evaluation Period

- IERs were submitted by experts
- Rapporteurs prepared draft Consensus Reports for discussion in Consensus meetings

## “Central” evaluation week

- Experts produce Consensus Reports during Consensus meetings
- Calibration meetings are held later in the week in case more than one expert group is involved per topic
- Expert Panel meeting



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# Consensus meeting

- It usually involves a **discussion** on the basis of the individual evaluations
  - It is not a simple averaging exercise
- The aim is to find **agreement** on comments and scores
  - Agree **comments before** scores!
  - If an applicant lacks basic operational capacity, please flag this under the ‘Resources’ criterion (composition of the team).
- **“Outlying” opinions** need to be explored
  - They might be as valid as others – be open-minded
  - It is normal for individual views to change
- **Moderated** by Agency staff
  - Neutral and manages the evaluation, protects confidentiality and ensures fairness
  - Ensures objectivity and accuracy, all voices heard and points discussed
  - Helps the group keep to time and reach consensus



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# Interpretation of scores

0	<b>0</b> The proposal fails to address the criterion or cannot be assessed due to missing or incomplete information.
1-5	<b>3 or 5</b> The criterion is inadequately addressed, or there are serious inherent weaknesses.
6-9	<b>7 or 9</b> The proposal broadly addresses the criterion, but there are significant weaknesses.
10-13	<b>11 or 13</b> The proposal addresses the criterion well, but a number of shortcomings are present.
14-17	<b>15 or 17</b> The proposal addresses the criterion very well, but a small number of shortcomings are present.
18-20	<b>19</b> The proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion. Any shortcomings are minor. <b>20</b> The proposal perfectly addresses the criterion, there are no shortcomings.

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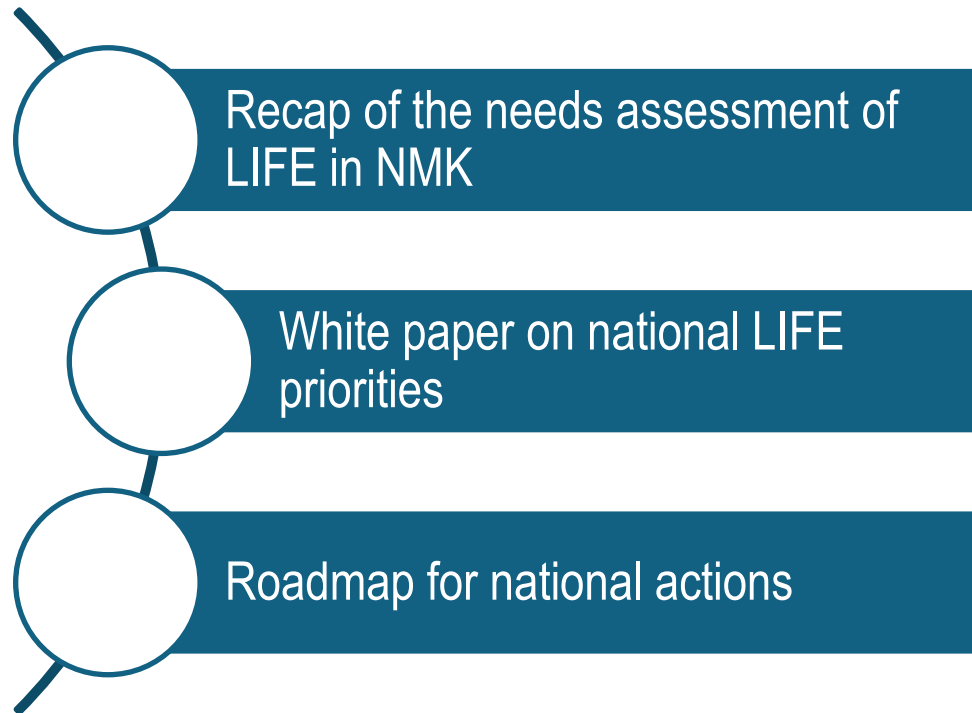
